2021-2022 Advocacy Efforts and Advocacy Subgroups

Updated 10-22-2021

The table below outlines issues of interest and concern to CCA that have carried over from the past year and issues that have arisen since the 2020-21 advocacy plan was developed.

At its July 12, 2021 meeting, the CCA Advocacy Committee began initial consideration of these issues, and of forming subgroups to work on the issues (including asking for volunteers) and coordinators for each subgroup. Once formed, the **Advocacy Subgroups** will meet as needed to identify the priorities with each policy issue, develop conceptual solutions, and specify policy proposals to implement the solutions. These will be reported to subsequent CCA Advocacy Committee meetings.
