## Older Adult Household Growth and Characteristics, 2023



• From 2020-2030 Colorado is expected to grow by 350,000 households or on average 35,000 per year. Households 65+ are expected to increase by 197,000 from 2020 to 2030. This means that over half of the growth in households is expected to be by households over 65. However, most of these households already live in Colorado, they are aging in place. (for example they are currently 58 and will age into the 65+ age group) Colorado does not have a large in migration of households 65+. Historically migration of older adults has been net zero, once the Census 2020 data is released by more detailed age an estimate for the last decade can be calculated. Initial data for this decade indicates Colorado could be experiencing a net out migration of older adults. (State Demography Office 2021 Forecasts)


- 81% of households 65+ own their homes. For those over 85 ownership falls to 68% (American Community Survey 2021) The average age for people entering senior living is 83 and the majority of the rooms are for rent.
- Holding the shares constant for owners at 81% it is estimated that the growth of 197,000 households 65+, 160,000 would be owners and 37,000 would be renters.
- More analysis would need to be done to identify what share of the renters or owners would have interest living in adult communities compared to traditional neighborhoods.
- 2% of the population over 65 live in nursing care communities and 6.7% of the population 85% live in nursing care communities. (2021 ACS)
- Households 65+: 67% live in family households. 27% live alone and 4% live with non-family members. (American Community Survey 2021)
- 14% of the population 65+ live below 150% of poverty
- 27% of owners 65+ spend 30% or more of their income on housing savings not included as income
- 59% of renters 65+ pay more than 30% of their income on rent savings not included as income

More time/research would be needed to estimate owner and renter by income for the 65+
population. However, below shows the relationship between owning and renting by income for
all age groups.



Population by age data on the State Demography Office website for each county and can
provide a forecast by age by county. This data would show areas expecting growth in the 65+
population. The largest growth is forecast along the Front Range as shown in the map below. A
table on the following page shows the growth forecast in households 65+ by county.
