Our approach is to review the bills one week and then the following week our members vote on whether to monitor, support, strongly support, or oppose but as we enter the last half of the session, bills move more quickly; so we may consider and take a position on a bill at the same meeting. If we keep a bill in our Bill watch account, we need a member to step up as a point of contact.

The list below prioritizes bills for discussion at the Monday morning meeting. **We ask that those who have volunteered to track a specific bill be prepared to report to the group on its status. Note that we are also listing committee hearing dates.**

The 2023 Legislative Session ends Monday, May 8th and we will be meeting on May 8th.
